The Dolder Grand Top Suites

Each of the Dolder Grand's four Top Suites is an expression of individual extravagance. The harmonious interior designs, one different from another, create an exclusive ambience in all four exquisite suites. Of the many illustrious guests who have graced the Dolder Grand with their presence, four have served as inspiration for the interior design, interpreted by London-based United Designers. The Terrazza Suite in the "Residence" category is the fifth exclusive suite at the Dolder Grand. The prices of the Top Suites range from CHF 5,500.00 to CHF 14,600.00 per night.

Maestro Suite

Inspired by Maestro Herbert von Karajan, the conductor. Classical music influences classical architecture: At the highest point in the tower of the Dolder Grand's Main Building is the Maestro Suite. This extraordinary two-floor Top Suite offers occupants some 400 square metres of living experience. The two bedrooms each have a luxurious marble bathroom, one in light Bianco Oro marble and the other in dark Portoro marble. In addition to a whirlpool and a steam shower, one of the bathrooms also features a sauna. The classically appointed dining room is located in the tower and can be served from the en suite kitchen. The library is ideal for reading or working in peace and quiet. On the upper floor, the comfortable tower room is the perfect place to relax. The spire's dark red timberwork has been restored to its original state on the basis of historical documentation. A subtle seating area with sofas and couches, together with a bar and fireplace, round off the distinctive club style. The spacious balcony of the tower room is the highest vantage point at the Dolder Grand. For modern outdoor living, the Maestro Suite offers another highlight: the private lounge terrace provides breath taking views of the city of Zurich, the lake and the Alps.

Carezza Suite

Inspired by Alberto Giacometti, the Swiss artist and plastics sculptor. Exceptional elegance on the top floor of the Spa Wing: The outstanding feature of the Carezza Suite (230 square metres) is its sculpturally inspired fittings and furnishings. All the organic-looking furniture and lighting are suggestive of works of art. The Top Suite has two bedrooms, each with a bathroom in white Bianco Lasa Vena Oro marble. In addition to a whirlpool and a steam shower, one of the bathrooms also features a sauna. In the spacious living area, large leather sofas and a modern fireplace invite you to linger for a while. The high ceiling and the floor-to-ceiling windows afford the suite a unique feeling of space. The integrated dining area can be served from the en suite kitchen. The avant-garde TV lounge is located in a separate room. Another highlight is the terrace: running round the entire suite, it offers a fabulous panoramic view of the city of Zurich, the lake and the Alps.

Masina Suite

Inspired by Giulietta Masina, the actress and wife of Federico Fellini. A touch of the glamour of the world and cinema of the 1950s: The Masina Suite (170 square metres) on the top floor of the Spa Wing has a distinctive Italian interior. The Top Suite has two separate bedrooms, each with a bathroom in dark green Verde Guatemala marble. In addition to a whirlpool, one of the bathrooms also features a sauna and a steam shower. At the centre of the spacious living room is an elegant, light-coloured Fendi sofa, and the large flat-screen TV is ideal for watching some cinematic highlights. A pool table is a further attractive feature for guests to enjoy. The dining area can be served from the en suite kitchen. The floor-to-ceiling windows afford the suite a unique feeling of space, which is extended by the view from the terrace overlooking high treetops and the lake below.

Suite 100

Inspired by the Rolling Stones (The 100 Club, London). The Rolling Stones are the epitome of rock 'n' roll at its best. The most surprising feature of Suite 100 (170 square metres) on the top floor of the Spa Wing is its unconventional extravagance. The mood of the interior is set by retro-style furniture and a predominantly black-and-pink decor redolent of the Swinging Sixties. The Top Suite has one bedroom with a spacious bathroom in black, equipped with a whirlpool, sauna and steam shower. The living room features corner sofas and pink loungers. The dining area can be served from the en suite kitchen. Another of the suite's special features is its own meeting room seating 10 people. The floor-to-ceiling windows afford Suite 100 a unique feeling of space, while the terrace offers a view of the historic Main Building, the lake and the Alps.

Residence Terrazza

Set in a terraced construction, the Terrazza Suite (390 square metres) with its three en suite bedrooms is especially suited to longer stays. From the master bedroom, guests pass through the walk-in wardrobe on their way to the luxurious master bathroom, which features a steam shower and a large whirlpool tub designed to accommodate two people. The walls are finished with a soft-brown, iridescent mother-of-pearl mosaic.

The luxury suite has both a private entrance and an entrance leading off from the Hotel itself. It boasts an open living and dining room, a kitchen and an impressively furnished office. A private glass lift links the entrance to the living area. Designed and furnished in a classic yet modern style, the suite emanates an air of exclusivity with warm, harmonious tones and ornate fixtures. The crowning glory is the terrace with a magnificent view over Lake Zurich.

Combination of the traditional and the modern

Between 2004 and 2008, the renowned London-based architecture practice Foster + Partners combined the historic Main Building of the Dolder Grand, some of which is listed, with modern architectural accoutrements. All annexes constructed after 1899 were demolished, and two modern wings – the Spa Wing and the Golf Wing – now enclose the Main Building. The Hotel makes use of geothermal energy for efficient energy consumption, with 70 probes having been sunk 150 metres into the ground. The Dolder Grand is a member of the Leading Hotels of the World and Swiss Deluxe Hotels.
